



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE TO THE COMMUNITY

This evolution and our successes could not have happened without the remarkable support of our members, volunteers, donors, sponsors, and community collaborators.

- Our annual Beltline Garden Festival and Lougheed House Christmas events saw substantial increases in attendance
- Our Membership grew 50% and fundraising revenues increased by 70%
- We worked with more community partners than ever before, and tripled the number of artists who exhibited in the House

This exciting progress is also the result of a revitalized staff, as last year we hired a new Development

Manager, Programs & Volunteer Manager, and Administrative Coordinator to join the Lougheed House team. With our expanded capacity, we developed a new 2019-21 Strategic Plan Framework which encompasses our ambitions on behalf of our community and stakeholders to be a place that is both historically relevant and a space of possibilities for now, and for the future. To accomplish our goals the three new plan priorities are: 1) Reinvigorate our Brand, 2) Create Exciting and Unique Visitor Experiences and 3) Build a Thriving and Sustainable House.

In 2018 Lougheed House Conservation Society received a further reduction in funding, through our Service Agreement with then Ministry of Culture and Tourism, Government of Alberta. This important aspect of our operational funding was reduced from \$475,000 to \$445,000, a reduction of \$30,000 or 6.3% annually. And of course, we are accountable to all stakeholders to remain sustainable. As such, diversification and growth of revenue streams is an organizational priority in our new strategic direction.

However, as part of this shift, Lougheed House must also expand its reach and role in the community to increase our relevance and better serve the community's changing needs and priorities. The outlook continues to be challenging for cultural non-profits, and because of this I am extremely grateful to our Board, staff, volunteers, members, donors and supporters for their remarkable commitment, enthusiasm and support for Lougheed House and all it offers the community. Without their support, our evolution would not be possible.

LOUGHEED HOUSE RE-IMAGINED

CALGARY IS A PLACE OF HISTORIC POSSIBILITIES - OUR NEW VISION

In response to Lougheed House's long-term planning, changing community priorities, and to ensure our ongoing relevance in the community Lougheed House Re-Imagined was born. This major new project is the result of a year-long engagement with our stakeholders, supporters and local community organizations to talk frankly about Lougheed House's exciting future and its role in our city. Feedback from some in our community was that Lougheed House presents a singular view of history. Members of diverse communities, including Indigenous, racialized, queer and feminist communities indicated that they want to be a part of more shared and diverse historical experiences represented at Lougheed House. With this valuable community feedback, we created two initiatives.

The first is a Community Engagement Framework, which will now guide our work with the community. Our city is growing and its interest in history and culture is evolving and expanding. We believe Lougheed House has a role to play in growing community and our idea of what Calgary was, and can be. We are excited by the possibilities that these discussions present to develop a rich, accessible and immersive experience with history in one of Calgary's most iconic historic homes. We know that it is the personal stories that we remember. Hearing about the lived experience of those who have gone before brings history to life. We know well some of these stories, as the Lougheed House's history is rich with them – the Lougheed family, the Canadian Women's Army Corps, and the Red Cross all share their history with this unique site. These stories will be told in new, immersive and compelling ways.

The Lougheed House – its original family, its later occupants, and the physical structure itself – all reflect Calgary's evolution and are an integral part of the city's development in the last 128 years. So why not expand on this history? No one else in Calgary is telling the story of our city in this diverse, dynamic and immersive way. We know Lougheed House can play that role. We're a smaller non-profit with big ambition. Join us as we create even more experiences of historic illumination, daring and inspiration, all in partnership with our community.

The second is the Lougheed House Re-Imagined Exhibition Development Plan that is the first step in the redevelopment of the second floor of Lougheed House and other aspects of the visitor experience to reflect the history of Lougheed House, and Calgary, both the histories you know, and the lesser-known stories that reflect a more diverse history of our city. Through this exciting new project, which will be developed over the next two years, the House is transforming into a place where the inquisitive mind can delve into the history of Calgary, where a visitor can pluck up a thread, a story that contributes to the intricately woven tapestry of our great city and explore how vital, how essential it is to the makeup of the Calgary of today.

VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION AWARD PAT & DAVE CROSS

TRUDY COWAN VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION AWARD, LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT

Each year, a Lougheed House volunteer is awarded the Trudy Cowan Volunteer Appreciation Award. Named after Lougheed House Conservation Society's founding Director, the Award honours the vital role volunteers play in the ongoing success of Lougheed House. In 2018, we are pleased to thank and celebrate two individuals, Pat and Dave Cross, for a special recognition of this award, Lifetime Achievement.

How did you first get involved in the House's restoration project?

In 2001, and as part of Lougheed House renovations before it opened in 2005, Pat was hired as a painter by Murray Ledarney of Historic Restorations to do much of the interior painting of Lougheed House. Says Pat: *Doing the painting, staining, varnishing and faux finishing on the Lougheed House was, without a doubt, the most ambitious challenge I have ever had in my 35 years as a painter.*

What part(s) of Lougheed House did you most enjoy restoring, and why? Pat appreciated looking at the rooms prior to restoration and then seeing the completed final product. Using 'turn-of-the-century' paint

charts, Pat reproduced historically appropriate colours and applied over 550 gallons of paints, stains, and varnishes!

Today, what is your favourite part of the Gardens/grounds, and why? As the House restoration reached completion, Pat saw the Head Gardener and the volunteer gardeners at work in the Beaulieu Gardens, "...it looked like fun," she said. It didn't take long before the dynamic duo of Pat and Dave were energetically contributing to the growth of the Gardens at Lougheed House: *The Circle Beds are high on Pat's list of favourites, as it is enjoyable to watch the designs come to life, from a simple drawing. An idea put to paper.*

How many years have you been involved as a volunteer at Lougheed House? Thirteen years.

Do you also garden at home, or somewhere other than at Lougheed House? We have always gardened, both flowers and vegetables. Early on we had a house in Exeter, Ontario, next door to a farmer. The farmer asked if we wanted to plant a garden on his property and we leapt at the idea (it was about half an acre). That year the gardens provided food for many of their neighbours. *There is nothing better than picking your own food that you have grown yourself.*

How has volunteering enriched your lives? *Getting to work with many different people over the years has been great, as most of the volunteers become friends, who share stories, which makes coming to the gardens a pleasure.*

Thank you, Pat and Dave, for your many contributions to Lougheed House. Said Head Gardener Marie Gattinger, *Attention to detail is important for them, and they have always surpassed it. This is their baby.*





EXHIBITION HIGHLIGHTS

Each year Lougheed House develops and hosts a number of temporary exhibitions featuring diverse perspectives on the stories of Lougheed House and the history of this place, Calgary. These exhibitions are both historical and contemporary. They feature art, artifacts and collections which encourage visitors to explore new perspectives on historical moments that continue to impact who we are as a community today.

THE FUTURE LOOKED BRIGHT: ART DECO IN EVERYDAY LIFE

February 21 - April 29, 2018

This exhibit showcased domestic art deco objects from local Calgary collectors, highlighting a period of Calgary and Lougheed House history known for its unique design aesthetic and new technologies. The exhibit featured a variety of objects from vacuum cleaners to ashtrays that combined practicality with the art deco look.

WILD IN THE WEST

Botanical art is a blending of art and science, producing delicate artworks that accurately depict plant species. The artworks in Wild in the West represented plants native to Alberta, in celebration of the Botanical Art Worldwide project that seeks to create a record of the world's biodiversity through local botanical illustrations.



FORMED BY SAND

June 21 - September 30, 2018

This exhibition explored early resource development, the relationship between Calgary's sandstone and Alberta's oil sands, and our relationship with the land, specifically stone. It also asked broader questions related to our relationship with the land: Does looking at human history through the lens of geologic time affect how we view our own histories? What stories can be told through stones?

PROGRAMMING HIGHLIGHTS

IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCES INSPIRED BY LOUGHEED HOUSE'S UNIQUE STORIES AND CALGARY'S CULTURAL & HISTORICAL LANDSCAPE

The success of 2018 reflects the contributions of many amazing collaborators. Local improv troupe *The Kinkonauts* offered a glimpse into the making of a 1920s radio play (complete with a real Foley table) during *RadioDaze*. *Calgary Pride's Reading with Royalty* program added glamour and an engaging story time to our annual *Beltline Garden Festival* while celebrating diversity and inclusion with all our guests. *Breakfast with Santa* gave children and parents alike a new immersive way of sharing in the magic of Christmas, including getting to see Santa really arrive on the Lougheed House roof! *Escape Capers* featured a House-wide puzzle experience, the *Holly Jolly Christmas Caper*, which sold out at 600 participants between Christmas and New Year's. We produced 24 public programs, both ticketed and free, which were filled with fun and immersive experiences that encouraged our guests to explore and interact with the history of Lougheed House in new ways.

LAUNCHING MÉTIS PIONEERS BOOK AT LOUGHEED HOUSE

Lougheed House offered the perfect venue to launch Red Deer-based historian Doris MacKinnon's newest book, *Métis Pioneers*, which explores the life of Isabella Clark Hardisty Lougheed of Lougheed House and Marie Rose Delorme Smith of Pincher Creek. Both women were Métis, and both were born in 1861. These resilient and early settlers of Alberta, despite experiencing the difficult transition out of the fur trade economy, flourished as important community leaders. Special guests included descendants of Isabella and members of the Lougheed Family: Michelle Lennox Hardisty, Doreen Lougheed, Joe Lougheed, Mary Lougheed, Audrey Poitras (Madame President of Métis Nation of Alberta), Marlene Lanz (then President, Métis Region 3), Lawrence Gervais (then Vice President, Métis Region 3), and Edmee Comstock (Métis Elder).

NEW ACQUISITIONS

LOUGHEED HOUSE IS GRATEFUL TO THE LOUGHEED FAMILY FOR THEIR CONTINUED SUPPORT

In recent years a number of significant gifts from the Lougheed family have been acquired by Lougheed House Conservation Society to expand our capacity to tell the Lougheed story and its significance to Canadian history. Last year the family gifted a number of key pieces including two insignia Premier Lougheed received, the Companion of the Order of Canada (1987) and the Alberta Order of Excellence (1989), which are on long-term loan and now hang in the Senator's writing room on the second floor of the House. Also included in this gift were a series of family photographs, and sculptures, originally part of the Lougheed's home and family belongings.

THE GARDENS

IN MEMORY OF THE HONOURABLE

E. Peter Lougheed, CC, AOE, QC (1928-2012)

Premier of Alberta, 1971 – 1985, “Peerless Prairie Leader” and Grandson of Sir James and Lady Isabella Lougheed, who built Lougheed House in 1891

Our Beaulieu Gardens flourished in the last year, with the hard work and dedication of our knowledgeable garden volunteers. This year we celebrated the legacy of Peter Lougheed. With the acquisition of two insignia Premier Lougheed received, the Companion of the Order of Canada, and the Alberta Order of Excellence, the designs of both medals were incorporated into the annual Lougheed House Gardens design, featured in the circular beds of the formal heritage gardens, and the flagpole flower beds. We also opened our new Peter Lougheed Memorial Garden on the west side of the estate. In the last several years, a garden volunteer, with support from the garden volunteer team, has designed and developed this garden, with several generous gift-in-kind contributions, in memory of the Honourable Peter Lougheed. It features a flowering crab tree and plenty of spring flowers, favourites of the former Premier.

ANNUAL FUNDRAISER - LADY GREY TEA

A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY TO EXPERIENCE WHAT IT WAS LIKE TO BE A LADY AT TEA IN CALGARY IN 1909

The Lady Grey Tea at the Lougheed House was held September 13th before a capacity audience of 56 ladies. It gave attendees the opportunity to learn more about the women who helped shape the early history of this city.

As an immersive, historic experience, the event hearkened back to a “Tea” that occurred at Lougheed House when Her Excellency Lady Grey was hosted by Mrs. Lougheed on the occasion of Governor General Earl Grey’s visit to Calgary.

Dr. Patricia Roome, a Canadian historian, specializing in Western Canadian women’s history, fascinated attendees with her knowledge and stories of what life was like for women long ago who attended the Tea for Lady Alice Grey in 1909. Attendees heard lesser known stories of the charitable work those women such as Lady Grey and Lady Lougheed did to help build hospitals, libraries and other community organizations.

Dr. Trudy Cowan, Lougheed House’s founding Director, gave an informative and entertaining presentation about the many different kinds of teas and the tea etiquette that was prevalent in Victorian and Edwardian times.

Tables were decorated with arrangements from Purple Orchid augmented by select flowers handpicked from Lougheed House Gardens and based on original event décor. Music was provided by Luka Coetzee and Ine-Wilme Coetzee and was facilitated by the Instrumental Society of Calgary.

Menu highlights included savory choices such as cucumber mint fromage frais tea sandwiches and organic sliced egg with sturgeon caviar. Earl Grey and herbal teas blended specially for Lougheed House were poured. Sweets were many and varied and chocolate dipped strawberries were hand passed to guests as they departed.

The fundraiser raised over \$6,000. Thank you to our speakers, our volunteers, and our sponsors without whom the fundraiser could not have happened. Our volunteer organizing committee: Andrea Brussa, Glenda Hess, Diane Howard, and Sheila LeBlanc ably led by Mary Lougheed. Sponsors included: The Restaurant at Lougheed House, Elizabeth Carey Design, Business for the Arts, Shannon Bergsma Photography, Alberta Laminations and Purple Orchid.



LOUGHEED HOUSE CHRISTMAS

NOVEMBER 14, 2018 - JANUARY 6, 2019

Lougheed House Christmas is six weeks of immersive events in a Victorian mansion that each year is thematically embellished by a team of professional interior designers who volunteer their skill and vision by creatively applying Christmas trees, ornaments, lights, furniture, candles, artifacts and decorative items throughout three floors of our Victorian grandeur. Their 2018 design theme, "Treats and Traditions," was gorgeously applied over many of our 20 original rooms and nooks, 11 fireplaces, 30 stained glass windows, turrets, bannisters, staircases, sconces, hardwood floors and decorative high ceilings.

To their design aesthetic we then crafted 20+ uniquely immersive Christmas programs and events – from cozy breakfasts with Santa, live performances of *A Christmas Carol* and collaborative code-breaking escape-room extravaganzas that set new attendance and revenue records – so that Calgarians of all ages could experience, either through paid or free events, our historic mansion in new ways while creating their own cherished family traditions. A popular new addition this year was the sold-out fundraiser, *First Look at Lougheed House Christmas*. This exclusive sneak-peak is bound to become a Christmastime staple where a limited number of guests enjoy the privilege of kicking off the holiday season with an unhurried first look at our festively adorned house.
